The Dance Program has three main purposes in revising our current admissions requirements, specifically:

- 1) We are trying to make pre-existing admission procedures more explicit, in particular, the presentation and content of the essay that all applicants to the major are required to write. We will be putting the four essay questions on our website and application procedures (including essay questions) will be available in the Dance Program Advising Office.
- 2) We wish to streamline the admissions process by moving to one application date per year. This will help us to plan the number of sections offered as well as set enrollment limits for courses.
- 3) We currently require students to be enrolled in a technique course. Instead of requiring this, we have added an assessment class once a year (in coordination with the spring application date) so that full-time faculty can sit together, after having reviewed transcripts and admissions essays, and come to a consensus on admittance to the major and student placement in technique classes. This will better serve transfer students and double majors. Alternative arrangements can be made to accommodate out-of-area applicants.

Admission Requirement: Admission is twice yearly: autumn for winter quarter admission, and spring for autumn quarter admission. Applicants should have completed or be currently enrolled in a dance-technique course. Applications are due in the departmental office by the fifth week of the quarter. Transfer students and out-of-area freshmen should consult the department for possible audition arrangements.

Admission Requirement:

Application to the Dance major occurs once a year, for autumn quarter, with an application deadline of March 1.

Together with the application and college transcript(s), applicants will be required to write a two-page essay that addresses one of four topics. Details regarding the essay format and topics are available on the department website, or at the Dance Program office in Meany Hall.

As a part of the application process, applicants must participate in a two-hour dance technique assessment. The date and time of the assessment will be posted on the department website. Applicants unable to attend should consult the Dance Program adviser to make alternate arrangements.

Applicants will be evaluated for admission on the basis of their academic record, quality of the two-page essay, and an assessment of the applicant's ability to meet minimum dance technique graduation requirements in a timely manner.

1) Cover sheet - include name, student number, email address and a brief statement (no more than 200 words) addressing why you want to be a dance major at the University of Washington

2) Essav

- Type-written, double-spaced, 12 point font, 2 pages maximum
- Choose one of the following four topics (essays will be evaluated on content and writing skills):
 - a) Who has been the most influential teacher in your life? Why
 - b) Are you attracted to a particular dance idiom? Why?
 - c) How has the study of another subject contributed to your understanding of dance as an art form?
 - d) Why do you think dance is important to humanity?
- 3) Unofficial transcript (may be obtained online or at the Registrar's Office)

All applicants must attend the Technique Assessment class on Sunday, March 28. The class will be in Meany Hall, Studio 265 from 10:00 am – 12:00 pm. If you cannot attend, please call the Dance Program office to make alternate arrangements.



- 1) Applicants must submit an official transcript.
- 2) All applicants are required to write a two-page (max.) essay for admission. Applicants will write on one of four topics. Details regarding essay topics and format are available on our website, or at the Dance Program Office in Meany Hall.
- 3) All applicants to the major (including transfer students) mustations two-hour technique assessment and prior to the beginning of spring quarter (date and time will be posted on our website). Prospective applicants unable to attend this assessment class should consult the Dance Program Advisor to make alternate arrangements.
