We propose to drop the requirement of an English composition course for admission to the major. This requirement dates back to a time when College writing requirements were weaker. The current substantial writing requirement of the College makes our requirement redundant. In addition, English composition courses are not required as a prerequisite to any economics course.

- 1. A minimum cumulative GPA for all prior college work of 2.80.

- 3. Completion of the following courses with a cumulative GPA of 2.80 and a minimum grade of 2.0 in each course: ECON 200; ECON 201; STAT 311; MATH 112 OR 124; 5-credit-English composition course.

- 3. The GPA for five of the seven courses required for entrance must be at least 2.80 with a minimum grade of 2.0 for each course.
- 4. Transfer students must be enrolled at the UW before they apply.
