The addition of SIS 201 to the European Studies core course requirement conforms to larger revisions for all major sequences in the School of International Studies. SIS 201 will replace the existing requirement for a cross-cultural or cross-disciplinary "case study" course, so that the total number of credit required in the major still totals 60. The purpose of the case study requirement was to insure at least a minimum of focused, comparative study within the major; however, it has been the faculty's experience that European Studies majors routinely deal with comparative issues in their other coursework. In addition, the thrust of SIS 201 ("Making of the 21st Century") is highly comparative, if on a global rather than a European scale.
