In the faculty's view it would be confusing and unwieldy to maintain a frequently-changing list of "case study" courses solely for students undertaking the minor. In addition, SIS 201 will provide comparative focus for Euro Studies minors. Under the new plan, the 15 credits of Euro Studies core courses (EURO 301, SIS 201, modern European survey course) will be the same for both the major and the minor.</p>
