Explanation of proposed changes or new programs. Attach additional page if necessary:
 These changes reflect a reallocation of faculty teaching to the 100-level from the 200-level that are a result of the foundations course initiative. The changes will give students more flexibility to complete their majors in a timely way and also to have the option of including one of the innovative new courses anthropology will be offering at the 100 level as part of their major. As a result of the reallocation of teaching, the total number of sociocultural 200-level lectures will be reduced from 6 (2 per quarter) to 4. Also it brings the requirement for 200-level sociocultural courses in line with the 200-level requirement for Archaeology and Biological Anthropology, each of which require only one 200-level course. This will allow students who wish to concentrate in the latter two areas more opportunity to take courses in their preferred sub-field.
