EXPLANATION OF AND RATIONALE FOR PROPOSED CHANGE

The Dual Degree Program within the College of Architecture and Urban Planning offering a Bachelor of Arts in Architectural Studies-a pre-professional program-and a Bachelor of Science in Construction Management has been amended by the faculty as follows.

- 1. Arch 431, Environmental Control Principles, has been included as a requirement.
- 2. The curriculum requirements for 6 optional architecture electives are replaced with 6 credits of selectives. 3 ARCH history/theory selectives and 3 ARCH graphics selectives. All of which need to be 300 or above. The selectives may be chosen from the Department of Architecture from approved course lists maintained by the Department.
- 3. The requirement for Arch 478 CAD and Working Drawings is replaced by the 3 credit ARCH graphics selective.

Reasons:

The exchange of electives for these selectives will help build critical thinking skills and strengthen the broad academic foundation essential for the successful study of architecture as students pursue a Master of Architecture - the professional degree and/or pursue professional work in the field. In addition, in exit surveys, students repeatedly request "more required content" for environmental science, building systems and construction, computers, and history theory courses.

THE BACHELOR OF ARTS DEGREE with a major in Architectural Studies.

Major Requirements

90 credits as follows:

- 1. Foundation courses: (60 credits) Arch300, 301, 302, 400, 401, 402, 320, 321, 322, 315, 380, 431, 460, CM 313
- 2. Approved Upper Division Electives: (21 credits) courses 300 or above in Architecture, the College of Architecture and Urban Planning, or outside of the college.
- 3. Selectives: (9 credits) 3 credits of graphics/media selective (Arch 316, 410, 412, 413, 415, 418, 481, 482, 484, 485, 486, 498, 598, 478); 3 credits of history/theory, (Arch 441, 442, 450, 452, 455, 457, 556, 558, 599, 452, 560, 561, 587); 3 credits of building sciences/materials and assemblies/structures. (Arch 420, 426, 430, 432, 570, 433, 434, 435, 530, 531, 598, 535). These courses must be upper division and may be selected from the Department of Architecture and the College of Architecture and Urban Planning or from across campus as approved.
- 4. The final 45 credits must be completed as a matriculated student in residence at the UW.
- 5. Minimum 2.50 cumulative GPA for all work done in residence.

THE BACHELOR OF SCIENCE DEGREE with a major in Construction Management

Major Requirements

92 credits as follows:

- Foundation Courses (73 credits): Arch 320, Arch 321, Arch 322; B CMU 301, CM 310, CM 311, CM 312, CM 313, CM 321, CM 322, CM 323, CM 331, CM 332, CM 333, CM 334, CM 410, CM 411, CM 412, CM 421, CM 422, CM 423, CM 432, and CM 433.
- 2. Construction/Construction Science Electives (6 credits): Two of the following: CM 415, CM 420, CM 425 or Arch 420
- 3. Approved Electives (8 credits): Upper division courses offered by the College of Architecture and Urban Planning or by the School of Business. (CM 413 recommended.)
- 4. Capstone Experience (5 credits): CM 431
- 5. Additional Degree Requirement: Minimum 2.50 cumulative GPA in upperdivision college courses.

BACHELOR OF ARTS IN ARCHITECTURAL STUDIES dual degree with BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN IN CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT

Dual Major Requirements

133 credits as follows:

- 1. Architecture Foundation courses: (60 credits) ARCH 300, 301, 302, 315, 320, 321, 322, 380, 400, 401, 402, 431, 460.
- 2. Architecture Selectives (6): 3 credits of graphics/media selective-(BIM recommended, ARCH 316, 410, 412, 413, 415, 418, 478, 481, 482, 484, 485, 486, 498, 598), 3 credits of history/theory selective (ARCH 441, 442, 450, 452, 455, 457, 556, 558, 560, 561, 587, 599) These courses must be upper division and may be selected from the Department of Architecture and the College of Architecture and Urban Planning or from across campus as approved.
- 3. CM Courses (64 credits): CM 310, CM 311, CM 312, CM 313, CM 321, CM 322, CM 323, CM 331, CM 332, CM 333, CM 334, CM 410, CM 411, CM 412, CM 421, CM 422, CM 423, CM 431 (capstone experience), CM 432, CM 433, BCMU 301.
- 4. Construction/Construction Science Electives (6 credits): Two of the following: CM 415, CM 420, CM 425 or ARCH 420
- 6. Approved Electives (3 credits): CM or ARCH courses.
- 7. Minimum 2.50 cumulative GPA for all work done in residence.

Note: Minimum of 225 credits required to complete dual degree.

The proposed changes in the dual degree program include:

- 1. ARCH 431 has been added to the curriculum to make the dual degree requirements consistent with the B.A. in Architectural Studies.
- 2. ARCH 478 has been removed to be replaced by an architecture graphics/media selective to make the dual degree requirements consistent with the B.A. in Architectural Studies.
- 3. ARCH history theory selective replaces the general arch selective to make the dual degree requirements consistent with the B.A. in Architectural Studies.
- 4. CM 320 is replaced by CM 311 to make the dual degree requirements consistent with the B.S. in Construction Management.

Admissions requirements for dual degree majors.

Dual degree majors first apply to the architecture program and must meet architecture admissions requirements. (See architecture admissions requirements in the general catalog.) Admitted architecture students apply to the construction management program during the Spring Quarter of their junior year or first year in the architecture program. Architecture students are waived of CM pre-requisite requirements but must take CM 313 and CM 323 prior to the CM application deadline which is April 1st.
