Two years ago we established an admission policy for this degree that in practice has created major bureaucratic road blocks for students. This has been especially true for transfer students. This proposal simplifies the process of declaring the major.

The minimum GPA for application to the School of Art is 2.50. Most successful applicants have significantly higher GPAs. The average GPA for successful applicants is 3.30.

For entering freshmen or currently enrolled students: After completing Art 190 students meet with an Art Adviser ~~in the School of Art~~ to declare the major.






Major Requirements

Painting and Drawing (65 credits total)

1. 5 credits, Art 190
2. 20 credits drawing classes: 5 credits ART 290; 10 credits ART 390; 5 credits ART 490.
3. 25 credits painting classes: 10 credits ART 292; 10 credits ART 392; 5 credits ART 492
4. 15 credits of Art History with a minimum 5 upper division to include one from ART H 203, 380, 381 or 384; one non-western from ART H 204, 205, 206, 230, 311, 312, 313, 315, 318, 321, 330, 331 or 337.
