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EXPLANATION OF AND RATIONALE FOR PROPOSED CHANGE

The changes are being made to update the General Catalog and DARS to reflect alternative course requirements for the major.

The Bachelor of Science in Construction Management has been amended by the faculty as follows:

1. CM 301 (4 credits), a newly created Construction Communications course, can be used in lieu of BCMU 301.
2. CM 430 (3 credits) is one of the options for the required 6 credits of construction/construction science electives.
3. The required 8 upper-division electives do not need to be taken in the College of Architecture and Urban Planning nor in the School of Business, however these elective must be construction-related and therefore courses from these two colleges are preferred. Courses not in these two colleges will require approval from a faculty adviser. CM 413 remains a recommended course.

5. Additional Degree Requirement: Minimum 2.50 cumulative GPA in upper-division college courses.








Jennifer,

We do not have a list of pre-approved general electives. The approval is done by each student's adviser in consultation with the individual student. Almost any design or business course has been determined to be construction-related. Thus most Business School or College of Architecture and Urban Planning courses would be fine. A problem occurred this year when students were taking any upper division elective, in particular Native American studies. The construction management faculty voted to require that the so-called "approved electives" be approved by the individual student's adviser, but not to make an exhaustive list of approved electives. Do you need more information on this issue?

Yes, I plan to participate in SCAP meetings next year whenever possible.
