Applications that meet the following criteria are accepted during autumn, winter, and spring quarters.

- 1) 2.00 cumulative GPA.
- 2) Interview with Dance Program advisor to assess applicants' dance background and preparation for the major to ensure proper placement in dance coursework.
- 3) Current enrollment in a UW dance technique course (ballet or modern) so faculty can determine that each student demonstrates the minimum level of dance skill required to ensure timely completion of requirements, and to evaluate the student's appropriate level for further dance study.

Studying Dance at the University of Washington

The Dance Major

The University of Washington Dance Program offers a dance major leading to a Bachelor of Arts degree. The curriculum offers a highly integrated course of study with a rigorous balance between creative work and academic study. Students will understand dance as an art form and as a cultural practice, and are given the opportunity to explore dance from multiple perspectives: kinesthetic, scientific, historic, aesthetic, compositional, musical, technological and ethnographic. Ballet and modern dance are the primary techniques, along with classes in non-western dance forms, somatic practices, and jazz. The Dance Program produces four concerts annually. Additional performance and choreographic opportunities are available through concerts sponsored by the Dance Student Association. In keeping with the liberal arts setting, students are encouraged to find the convergence between dance and other academic and artistic pursuits that interest them. Faculty and advisors work closely with students to guide them on the educational track that best serves their career goals The undergraduate curriculum serves as preparation for graduate study, a performance career, dance related occupations such as physical therapy and dance therapy, and other fields demanding strong communication skills, creativity, commitment, and the ability to work both collaboratively and independently.

Application Procedures for the Major

Application to the major is ongoing and only available to current University of Washington students. Students interested in applying to the dance major are encouraged to contact the Dance Program's academic adviser. To apply, a student needs to submit an unofficial copy of their transcript (to confirm minimum GPA and time to degree). In addition, students must be enrolled in a UW technique class (ballet or modern) so that faculty may evaluate their technique. This allows the department to provide the student a recommendation as to appropriate technique levels for further study. Incoming freshmen or transfer students should meet with the Program adviser as soon as possible to determine a good starting point for coursework at the UW.

Students interested in the dance major are encouraged to visit the Dance Program and to attend UW dance performances. Prospective students should write or call ahead for an appointment and come prepared to participate in a dance technique class. The academic dance adviser and faculty members are always happy to answer questions about the Dance Program.

The Dance Minor

The Dance Minor consists of 25 credits: 15 credits of technique (ballet, modern or jazz) and 10 credits of academic coursework (Dance History, Anatomy for Dance, etc). Applications can be completed at anytime as long as the student has a minimum of 90 credits and has taken at least one Dance course at the UW. No special appointments are necessary to complete the dance minor paperwork.
