First- and second-quarter language courses may not be counted toward the VLPA requirement. Individuals & Societies includes courses in history, economics, psychology, and sociology which stress the social nature of mankind, and the development and analysis of societies and social institutions. Courses that count toward these requirements are identified as VLPA or I&S in the Course Descriptions and in the quarterly Time Schedule. A minimum of 10 credits is required in each area.

First- and second-quarter language courses may not be counted toward the VLPA requirement. 1&S includes courses in subjects such as history, economics, psychology, and sociology which stress the social nature of mankind, and the development and analysis of societies and social institutions. Courses that count toward these requirements are identified as VLPA or 1&S in the Course Descriptions and in the quarterly Time Schedule.
