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EXPLANATION OF AND RATIONALE FOR PROPOSED CHANGE

The proposed changes are intended to focus the content-related coursework of students pursuing the minor in Japanese more tightly on the fields of literature, linguistics, and other humanistic disciplines. Some of the earlier wording erroneously gave the impression that further language coursework could satisfy the content-related portion of the minor. In addition, under the current rules, students can complete the minor with a combination of language-courses and Japan-related coursework completed entirely outside the department, thus never having the opportunity to study Japanese literature or linguistics with department faculty.

While not wishing to limit the content-related portion of the major exclusively to coursework in Japanese literature and linguistics, faculty believe that these modest restrictions are healthy and necessary to preserve the intellectual integrity of the minor.

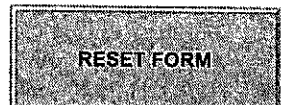
