We propose adding a Specialized Experience in Psychology requirement to the BA degree. This requirement would parallel but differ from the Specialized Experience in Psychology requirement we already have in place for the BS in psychology.

Proposed New Requirement for the BA

3 credits from the following list:

PSYCH 494 Field Study in Animal Behavior (2-3, max. 9)

PSYCH 496 Undergraduate Teaching Experience in Psychology (2-3, max. 6)

PSYCH 497 Undergraduate Fieldwork (2-5, max. 10)

PSYCH 498 Directed Reading in Psychology (1-3, max. 18)

PSYCH 499 Undergraduate Research (1-3, max. 18)

UW Study Abroad-Departmental Program credits

UW Study Abroad-Affiliated Program credits

We would accept other appropriate University of Washington specialized experience activities for the BA from an approved list available in the Psychology Advising Office and/or approved on a case by case basis. Examples are Service Learning, Inner Pipeline, and Alternative Spring Break.

63 to 65 credits as follows:

- One lab course from PSYCH 330, PSYCH 331, PSYCH 332, PSYCH 361, PSYCH 417, PSYCH 418, or PSYCH 419
