EXPLANATION OF AND RATIONALE FOR PROPOSED CHANGE

SISEA 242 (Introduction to Contemporary Japan) is being added to the requirements of Asian Studies major (Japan Concentration) to count for the basic civilization course requirement.* For consistency and simplicity, the faculty also wishes to add SISEA 242 as an option for students completing the Japan Studies minor and all other Asia minors (China Studies, Korea Studies, South Asian Studies, Southeast Asian Studies).

The addition of SISEA 242 will provide students who need (or elect) a "Japan civ" course with the choice between SISEA/HSTAS 241, a historically-focused survey, and 242, a course focused on present-day Japan's politics, economics, and society. This change will help JSIS insure that a "countable" Japan survey for the various minors will be available in a given year, now that scheduling of SISEA/HSTAS 241 is determined by the History Department (the new Japanese historian is a 100% History appointment).
