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The Department of Statistics would like all majors to earn a minimum cumulative grade-point average of 2.50 in all courses used to satisfy departmental requirements.

Statistics majors complete departmental requirements with courses that begin with prefixes other than STAT, such as MATH or CSE. Currently, DARS only detects the 2.50 GPA requirement in courses with a STAT prefix. This means that some students are being held responsible for this requirement, and others are not. Changing this will ensure that all prefixes are covered and the department can hold all statistics students to a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.50.
