The proposed changes are part of the department's decision to eliminate the tracks and the three-quarter long senior thesis requirement. The purpose of the tracks, when instituted nearly thirty years ago, was to provide students with theory, content, and method that would provide the foundation for a final senior project in a particular area (e.g. media, health, race and gender, law). Upon review of enrollment patterns among Women Studies majors, the department found that over the last decade or so, most students have tended to abandon the track, and, instead, have created individualized tracks that more closely reflected their academic interests and career goals. In addition, many students who stayed with a particular track chose senior thesis topics that were not related to the track, but reflected their current interests.

In response to this long-time trend of student curricular choices, the department has developed a set of new major requirements that retain the basic pedagogical goals of the department without tying students to a particular content area and have replaced the senior thesis requirement with a one-quarter senior capstone course (see accompanying proposal). Decoupling courses from the tracks will afford students a greater degree of flexibility when choosing courses to fulfill major requirements.
