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MINOR REQUIREMENTS. Students must complete 30 credits for a minor.

1. WOMEN 200 Introduction to Women Studies (5 credits). An equivalent course from another college can also satisfy this requirement. Women 200 is a prerequisite for most other Women Studies courses.

5 additional lower-division credits in Women Studies courses (excluding WOMEN 290). Options include:

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 WOMEN 206 Philosophy of Feminism (offered jointly between Women Studies, Philosophy, & Political Science), WOMEN 207 Introduction to Feminist Theory, WOMEN 257 Psychology of Gender, WOMEN 283 Introduction to Women's History

One course dealing with race and ethnicity (5 credits). Students fulfill this requirement by taking either WOMEN 322 or WOMEN 456 (NO SUBSTITUTES)

2. 15 additional upper-division (300-400 level) credits in Women Studies courses (excluding WOMEN 495, 497, and 499, but including up to 5 credits of WOMEN 490)
