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EXPLANATION OF AND RATIONALE FOR PROPOSED CHANGE

The Law, Societies, and Justice Program is developing a new 200-level introductory class, enabling our faculty to connect with interested students earlier in their education (see proposal for new LSJ 200 course). This course will eventually serve 200-600 students a year. This is a significant change for the program and it will mean reallocating our present list of LSJ core classes to free up faculty and finances for the course (see new LSJ/SIS 366 course and course change to create LSJ/SIS 322). These changes only affect the list of classes that students can use as "LSJ Core Courses," and therefore it is not a change to the structure of the LSJ curriculum, only to the courses that exist in that structure. Students need to take at least two LSJ Core Courses in order to complete the LSJ minor and this proposed change will increase the number of courses that count towards that requirement.






