Dear Bob.

Enclosed you will find two forms (# 1503), signed by Gary Handwerk, which we would d like to be able to send along to the College Curriculum Committee in the near future.

These request some changes in the 'rules' for our Department major, the first formally requiring ENGL 202/197 for admission to the major. The second may prove a bit more problematic since it asks the powers-that-be to allow us to open up the range of courses we might allow students to use as their senior capstone courses for the major. I am not altogether sanguine that the College Curriculum Committee and the Faculty Council on Academic Standards will accede to our rather open-ended and locally adjustable definition of what might be acceptable capstones for our students. If they do not grant us this, then we will simply submit individual requests for additional courses as they are approved by our faculty, two of which we already stand ready to submit. But we thought we would try this more flexible wording first.

If you approve these, please return the forms to me and I will make the necessary copies for transmittal to the College Curriculum Committee.
