(Use additional pages if necessary). We wish to drop Geog 205 (Introduction to the Physical Sciences and the Environment) as a required "Foundations" course. This course is anomalous in our social science curriculum in that we do not offer any other physical geography courses, so we no longer see such a course as essential to a degree in our discipline. We do, however, address many of the social dimensions of the subject -- resource analysis and management, land use, public policy, environmental justice, etc-- in many of our other courses. To maintain the required 60 Geog credit requirement, we wish to change the permitted number of elective credits from 5 to 10.
