Globalization & Citizenship was added to the curriculum in 2008-09 to complement the material covered in Media & Society.

The faculty believe this requirement will bring more coherence to the Communication curriculum. TCOM 201 was created as a general introduction to the field of communcation studies. TCOM 230 was developed as a more topical approach to many of the same issues and ideas. As such, the objectives and desired outcomes of these courses are quite similar. Both of these courses prepare students for work in the Communication concentration and this prerequisite is designed to ensure that these students have such a foundation before taking more advanced courses.

Course desciptions for TCOM 201 and TCOM 230 follow:
