The two primary reasons for these changes are (1) enhancing achievement of our Learning Goals and (2) bringing our requirements in line with our revised Mission Statement and the growth of the discipline of Women Studies. (1) The Learning Goals require students to increase (a) the range of scholarship they are accountable for, (b) the sophistication of their analytic skills and (c) development of their written and verbal skills. To accomplish these goals, we re-designed our courses to build on each other. (2) The discipline's knowledge base has rapidly increased and gained more coherence. The increased pre-requisites and limitations on courses which count toward the meter are designed to guide students through this scholarship more systematically.

Women Studies Minor Requirements

for students declaring a minor in the Fall Quarter 2009 or later

- 1. WOMEN 200 <u>Introduction to Women Studies</u> or transfer equivalent (5 cr.). Women 200 is a prerequisite for most other Women Studies courses.
- 2. One elective 200-level course in Women Studies or transfer equivalent (5 cr.). Women 299 does not count toward this requirement.
- 3. Women 300 <u>Gender, Race, and Class in Social Stratification.</u> (5 cr.) <u>Prerequisite: WOMEN 200.</u> Women 300 is a prerequisite for the Senior Capstone and variable credit courses (494, 495, 497, and 499).
- 4. 15 elective upper-division (300-400 level) Women Studies credits minimum of 10 credits must be graded. Maximum credits from our variable credit course (495, 496, 497, and/or 499) can be applied toward this requirement.

Thank you for your inquiry on this. On one hand, yes, there is a specific problem this addresses: We have a very flexible program in which students can take variable credit internships, study-abroad and other courses that are non-graded. Non graded courses do not provide adequate feedback to the student on their level of preparation and the result has created a pedagogical challenge when students arrive near the end of the major with significant deficits. This is only one of several strategies (e.g. approaches to writing assignments) that we are taking to address this.

Another impetus comes from students themselves: Many who are potential honors students don't realize early enough that the lack of graded credits jeopardizes their eligibility for Honors.

This requirement, however, should not be abstracted from the over-all rationale for the changes we made to the major: As our major has grown, and as we have more experience with the capstone as a way of assessing students' learning across the major, we are working to build more academic coherence into our major. This credit requirement is only one piece of the puzzle.
