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EXPLANATION OF AND RATIONALE FOR PROPOSED CHANGE

The Department of Anthropology has over the past six years undertaken an undergraduate curriculum initiative. This initiative has included restructuring the foundations courses, the development of track options within the major, and unrolling and advertising one of the options, namely the Medical Anthropology and Global Health (MAGH) track. These efforts have led to a rapid rise in the number of Majors in Anthropology. In two years our number of majors has risen from 330 to 600. We have tremendous demand for the major overall, and in particularly for our MAGH track. Currently the MAGH track option is an informal track, and is not transcribed. The Anthropology Major is an open major. Since our rapid growth has occurred during a budget crisis, we are not able to add instruction to meet this demand. Therefore, we wish to make the Anthropology Major a minimum requirement major, and to have two competitive options: Medical Anthropology and Global Health, and a new option called Anthropology of Globalization.





The Department of Anthropology began an exhaustive re-evaluation of our curricular offerings several years ago and the result of that effort has been an explosion in number of undergraduate majors: the major grew from 350 to 600 students since autumn quarter 2008. A major contributor to this increase in numbers was the development of a track that explicitly recognizes anthropology's long-standing relationship with and relevance to global health sciences research and practice, called Medical Anthropology and Global Health (MAGH). MAGH has existed for several years as an unofficial track and has drawn tremendous numbers of students to the major, overwhelming our ability to adequately serve these students.

The intent of this 1503 is to make the Anthropology Major selective by adding the completion of minimum requirements before application to the major and to add two new competitive options (MAGH and Anthropology of Globalization (AG)) to the major. We want to make AG competitive from the beginning because we anticipate that it could create enthusiasm similar to MAGH.

Detailed below is the current and proposed catalog copy for Anthropology. The changes include

1. deletion of the current Admissions Requirements and substitution with the new minimum requirements and
2. addition of the option requirements.

No changes to the existing, standard course of study in Anthropology is proposed.

Bachelor of Arts

Suggested First- and Second-Year College Courses: Any two of the following: ANTH 202, ANTH 203, ANTH 204, ANTH 206, ANTH 207, ANTH 208, ANTH 209, ANTH 210, or ANTH 228; ARCHY 205; BIO A 201; at least one from SOC 220, STAT 220, STAT 311, or Q SCI 381.

Department Admission Requirements

Major Requirements

55 credits as follows:

1. *Core courses (20 credits):* ARCHY 205, BIO A 201; any 200-level ANTH course; and one of the following: SOC 220, STAT 220, STAT 311, Q SCI 381
2. 35 additional ANTH, ARCHY, and BIO A credits distributed across the subfields or concentrated as suits the interests of the student. 20 of these credits must be in upper-division (300- or 400-level) courses. Students may count one 100-level ANTH, ARCHY, or BIO A course toward the major, but are not required to do so.
 - a. The following AIS courses may apply toward this requirement: AIS 201, AIS 202, AIS 203, AIS 240, AIS 311, AIS 312, AIS 316, AIS 317, AIS 330, AIS 335, AIS 340, AIS 443.
 - b. Maximum 12 credits from ANTH 499, ARCHY 499, and BIO A 499 combined can be counted toward the major.
3. *Additional major requirements:*
 - a. Courses with a grade of 1.9 or lower do not count toward the major.
 - b. At least 25 credits in the major must be completed with a minimum grade of 3.0.
 - c. Transfer students must complete a minimum of 15 upper-division credits in anthropology at the UW.

Department Admission Requirements

1. A minimum of 15 ANTH/ARCH/BIOA credits;
2. A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 for ANTH/ARCH/BIOA credits, with no less than a 2.0 in each course;
3. A minimum GPA of 2.5 for all prior college work including transfer credits.

Options

In addition to the standard Anthropology course of study, two options are available in the Anthropology Major:

1. Medical Anthropology and Global Health (MAGH)
2. Anthropology of Globalization (AG).

Admission to either option is competitive. The application deadline is the second Friday of Autumn, Winter and Spring quarters. Applications will be available on the departmental website on the first day of the quarter. Transfer students must be admitted to the University before they can apply to the major.

In addition to meeting the requirements for admission to the Major, students who wish to apply in an option must complete additional application requirements available in the Anthropology advising office.

Note that meeting the minimum requirements for admission to the Major does not guarantee admission to either option. Students who apply for an option will be notified of the Departmental Review Committee's admissions decision by the end of week 5 of the quarter in which they apply. Anthropology students are not required to participate in an option; they may select to follow the standard course of study given below.

Major Requirements

The standard course of study for Anthropology includes 55 credits as follows:

1. Core courses (20 credits): ARCHY 205, BIO A 201; any 200-level ANTH course; and one of the following: SOC 220, STAT 220, STAT 311, Q SCI 381
2. 35 additional ANTH, ARCHY, and BIO A credits distributed across the subfields or concentrated as suits the interests of the student. 20 of these credits must be in upper-division (300- or 400-level) courses. Students may count one

must be in upper-division (300- or 400-level) courses. Students may count one 100-level ANTH, ARCHY, or BIO A course toward the major, but are not required to do so.

a. The following AIS courses may apply toward this requirement: AIS 201, AIS 202, AIS 203, AIS 240, AIS 311, AIS 312, AIS 316, AIS 317, AIS 330, AIS 335, AIS 340, AIS 443.

b. Maximum 12 credits from ANTH 499, ARCHY 499, and BIO A 499 combined can be counted toward the major.

c. For students enrolled in the MAGH or AG options, these additional requirements must be met:

Medical Anthropology and Global Health Option Requirements:

Completion of ANTH 215 and completion of 15 credits from ANTH and BIO A courses approved for the MAGH option (available in the Anthropology advising office, Denny Hall 243 or on the Department of Anthropology website).

Anthropology of Globalization Option Requirements:

Completion of 20 credits from courses in ANTH, ARCHY, and BIO A approved for the option (available in the Anthropology advising office, Denny Hall 243 or on the Department of Anthropology website).

3. Additional major requirements:

- a. Courses with a grade of 1.9 or lower do not count toward the major.
- b. At least 25 credits in the major must be completed with a minimum grade of 3.0.
- c. Transfer students must complete a minimum of 15 upper-division credits in Anthropology at the UW.
