To borrow Kathryn's words: All students who are admitted Aut 2010 or later must take the 3 credit portfolio capstone (all majors). Students who were admitted prior to that time may choose to take a one of the current capstone options OR the 3 credit portfolio capstone. In other words they have the choice of being grandfathered under the old system.
