EXPLANATION OF AND RATIONALE FOR PROPOSED CHANGE

Currently, Italian majors are required to complete two "cuscinetto," or, "cushion" courses as part of their departmental requirements. We would like to add ITAL 343, a course approved on September 19, 2009, to the list of courses that may meet this requirement. The current list is as follows: ITAL 341, ITAL 342, ITAL 351, ITAL 352. Like the courses currently on the list, the purpose of ITAL 343 is to better prepare students to undertake the challenges of more advanced literature classes. In particular, students who successfully complete ITAL 343 will become well versed in the basics of literary analysis (rhetorical devices and figures of speech, with particular attention being paid to poetry) and will be able to confidently approach texts and perform the level of analysis required in more advanced literature courses.
