<b>EXPLANATION OF AND RATIONALE FOR PROPOSED CHANGE</b> For new program, please include any relevant supporting documentation such as student learning outcomes, projected enrollments, letters of support and departmental handouts. TSMIN 200, International Interactions, has been one of two possible choices (TSMIN 200 or TGH 301) for fulfilling 5 of the 10 credits specified by Option Three of the "Language or International Course(s)" requirement for the American Studies concentration. Two new world history courses were recently approved: TSMIN 100 World History: Prehistory to 1500 (permanent change from TCXG 230 approved 6/16/09) and TSMIN 101 World History II: 1500-present (permanent new course approved 2/16/10). It is the intent of the IAS history faculty to no longer teach TSMIN 200 and instead to allow students to fulfill Option Three by completing 5 credits selected from TSMIN 100, TSMIN 101, or TGH 301, plus 5 credits in an additional international course. TSMIN 100 and TSMIN 101 were first offered in 2010, Winter and Spring quarters respectively. We are asking for this 1503 to be effective Winter 2010 so that students may use either course to satisfy the first 5 credits of the international course requirement in the American Studies concentration. Note: IAS has proposed new prefixes and numbers for many courses. In the proposed scheme, TSMIN 100 transforms to THIST 150 and TSMIN 101 to THIST 151.



Option one (5 credits): Students must demonstrate competency in a foreign language through

one of four ways: three years of high school in one language, FL 103 at the college level, native

speaker certification, placement through testing in the second year of the language.

Students

meeting this requirement will need an additional IN (international) course of 5 credits.

Option Two (5 credits): One college level foreign language course beyond the first year, i.e.

French 201. Five credits of that counts here.

Option Three (10 credits): ~~TSMIN 200 (International Interactions)~~ or TGH 301 (Global Interactions) plus one additional IN course.
