IVA Honors Option: Students interested in pursuing the Honors track must apply upon earning 20 credits of studio art. (Transfer students should contact the School of Art Advising Office for details on application.)

Admission to the program will require minimum 3.3 cumulative UW GPA and minimum 3.5 cumulative Art Major GPA. In addition to the GPA requirement, students will be evaluated and selected through a formal application and portfolio review. Students in the program will be required to take at least 2, 400-level courses and participate in an exhibition at the end of their final year of study.

Bachelor of Arts with distinction Interdisciplinary Visual Arts

Explanation and Rational

In response to both student demand and the results of the School of Art 10-year review, the faculty seeks to develop an Honors option for the Interdisciplinary Visual Arts major. This option will encourage increased and sustained achievement of undergraduate students through a minimum GPA requirement, competitive admissions process, advanced coursework, and culminating exhibition leading to a Bachelor of Arts with distinction in Interdisciplinary Visual Arts (IVA). We believe this option will help increase the rigor of the IVA program and enhance the experience for advanced students.

Eligibility

- Declared IVA major
- 20 credits of studio art
- Minimum 3.3 cum/ 3.5 major GPA

Application & Selection Process

Students meeting the minimum eligibility requirements must prepare a portfolio and artist statement for review by a panel of IVA faculty. Applications will be considered on a rolling basis.

Portfolio Requirement

- Artwork: 5-8 pieces that exemplify the student's strengths from the past 12months.
- Image List: A list identifying the works by date, medium, technique used, size and year/quarter/class completed, as well as a short description of the assignment.

Portfolios may reflect a range of skills OR they may reflect a depth of study in one medium.

Artist Statement of Intent

- 1 page artist statement addressing the following:
 - Why are you applying to the honors program in IVA?
 - What is that direction of your work and how is it best accomplished within the IVA honors program? Describe the intentions behind your most recent work.

Program Requirements

<u>GPA</u>

Students must maintain a minimum 3.3 cumulative GPA and a minimum 3.5 major GPA to be eligible to graduate with distinction, significantly higher than the 2.0 minimum requirement for other IVA majors.

Advanced Coursework

10 - 15 credits - ART 400 - IVA Senior Studio

The IVA Senior Studio class is currently an optional part of the IVA curriculum. Students in the Honors Program will be required to take this course at least twice and will be encouraged to take it up

to three times. At least one Senior Studio must occur in the final quarter of attendance (with the exception of student graduating in the summer, for whom the spring quarter section of ART 400 is acceptable).

Exhibition

The exhibition component is a public presentation of finished senior quality work at the Jacob Lawrence Gallery. Senior quality work is a culmination of years of interdisciplinary studio practice, research and development in a coherent body of work.

The exhibition is accompanied by a short public presentation about the development of the work and followed by a discussion.

Body of work presented in the exhibition will receive one-on-one critique with at least 2 of the program faculty.

The exhibition is important because in the visual art field this is the final step that completes the process of art making. The public discussion component allows faculty and fellow students to get an insight to the student's concepts and the work process, engage in a dialogue about the artwork, and at the same time cultivate a high standard for such exit experience.

Exit Portfolio

Summary and documentation of completed artworks, selected to present coherence and a high standard of skill and conceptual development at the senior level. Exit portfolio will be submitted in digital format on a CD to be reviewed by a panel of IVA faculty and will be retained by the program.

The Exit portfolio is:

- 10 artworks (good quality documentation)
- Image List
- Resume
- Artist Statement

The exit portfolio requirement prepares students to transition into professional practice after graduation. Exit portfolios are similar to those required by all applications in the field of visual art: exhibition, graduate study, or job.
