- Language courses: 15 credits at or above the third-year level. Must include CHIN 451, plus other courses drawn from among CHIN 212 (CHIN 212 and CHIN 213, heritage-track Chinese, considered equivalent to third-year level), CHIN 213, CHIN 301, CHIN 302, CHIN 303, CHIN 411, CHIN 412, CHIN 413, CHIN 421, CHIN 422, CHIN 423, CHIN 452, CHIN 453, CHIN 470, and CHIN 482.
- China-related humanities courses: 15 credits drawn from among the following: ASIAN 201, ASIAN 204, ASIAN 211, ASIAN 263 (when China is the topic), CHIN 342 (or CHIN 442), CHIN 373, CHIN 374, CHIN 380, CHIN 381, CHIN 385, CHIN 443, and CHIN 461, CHIN 462, CHIN 463.

Chinese: 30 credits as follows:

- Language courses: 15 credits at or above the third-year level. (May include CHIN 212, CHIN 213 (CHIN 212 and CHIN 213, heritage-track Chinese, considered equivalent to third-year level), CHIN 301, CHIN 302, CHIN 303, CHIN 411, CHIN 412, CHIN 413, CHIN 421, CHIN 422, CHIN 423, CHIN 451, CHIN 452, CHIN 453, CHIN 470, CHIN 482, and CHIN 496 (when the topic is advanced language instruction).
- Introduction to Chinese linguistics: 5 credits of CHIN 342/442 2)
- China-related humanities courses: 10 credits, at least 5 of which are drawn from among the following department courses: ASIAN 200, ASIAN 201, ASIAN 204, ASIAN 207 (when China is the topic) ASIAN 211, ASIAN 263 (when China is the topic), ASIAN 401, ASIAN 404, CHIN 373, CHIN 374, CHIN 380, CHIN 381, CHIN 385, CHIN 443, CHIN 461, CHIN 462, and CHIN 463.

The remaining 5 credits may also be taken from among the above-listed courses, or taken in courses explicitly related to China in humanities and social sciences from such departments as History, Anthropology, Art History, International Studies, Linguistics, Sociology, etc., with departmental approval.

Courses taken for the minor must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0. No more than 15 transfer credits may count toward a Chinese language minor. For students who need to take first-year Chinese in order to progress to the minor program, the total credit requirement is 60.

Chinese: 30 credits as follows:

- Language courses: 15 credits at or above the third-year level. Must include CHIN 451, plus other courses drawn from among CHIN 212 (CHIN 212 and CHIN 213, heritage-track Chinese, considered equivalent to third-year level), CHIN 213, CHIN 301, CHIN 302, CHIN 303, CHIN 411, CHIN 412, CHIN 413, CHIN 421, CHIN 422, CHIN 423, CHIN 452, CHIN 453, CHIN 470, and CHIN 482.

Chinese: 30 credits as follows:

- 1. Language courses: 15 credits at or above the third-year level <u>chosen from</u> CHIN 212, <u>CHIN 213</u> (CHIN 212 and CHIN 213, heritage-track Chinese, considered equivalent to third-year level), CHIN 301, CHIN 302, CHIN 303, CHIN 411, CHIN 412, CHIN 413, CHIN 421, CHIN 422, CHIN 423, <u>CHIN 451</u>, CHIN 452, CHIN 453, CHIN 470, CHIN 482, <u>and CHIN 496 (when the topic is Advanced Language Instruction).</u>
- 2. <u>Introduction to Chinese Linguistics (5 credits): either CHIN 342 or CHIN 442.</u>
- 3. China-related humanities courses (10 credits): at least one of ASIAN 200, ASIAN 201, ASIAN 204, ASIAN 207 (when China is the topic), ASIAN 211, ASIAN 263 (when China is the topic), ASIAN 401, ASIAN 404, CHIN 373, CHIN 374, CHIN 380, CHIN 381, CHIN 385, CHIN 443, CHIN 461, CHIN 462, and CHIN 463; remaining credits from above or from an approved list of China-related electives.
- 4. Minimum 2.00 cumulative GPA for courses applied to the minor.
- 5. Minimum of 15 credits taken in residence at the University of Washington.
