EXPLANATION OF AND RATIONALE FOR PROPOSED CHANGE

Urban Studies is making the following changes to help students better understand the core requirements							
and to plan for their course of study.							
 To help with planning and sequencing, we are clearly specifying pre-requisites for TURB 350 and TURB 492. 							
2. In addition, both to recognize the work done in TURB 350, TGIS 415 and TURB 492, and to help							
students meet their "W" requirements within the core, these courses have been approved as "W" (writing							
intensive) courses and noted as such.							
3. To help students understand the types of requirements in the core, we are changing "techniques"							
requirement to "methods" requirement, and we have added a section titled "captsone requirement." The program also is including TGIS 415 as a capstone option since it also meets similar writing and research							
requirements and learning objectives.							
4. The final set of changes are within the "field course requirement" section. We are adding "formerly							
TURB 415" so that students who took TURB 345 in previous years know they have already covered that							
requirement. We also have added another option for meeting this requirement, TURB 379.
