EXPLANATION OF AND RATIONALE FOR PROPOSED CHANGE

The faculty of the UW Bothell Education Program have revised the requirements of the Education Minor to strengthen the focus of the program of study and attract pre-major students to the study of Education and its role in society. As part of this revision the core course for the minor, "Education and Society", is being changed from a 300-level to a 200-level course and is being increased from 3 to 5 credits in order to incorporate a previously separate community-based learning component into the course. These changes to "Education and Society" ensure that all minor students will study core concepts early in the minor sequence, will complete a community-based learning experience in an educational setting, and will have streamlined elective options for successful completion of the minor.

In conjunction with these changes to "Education and Society", the program is requesting to change the name of the minor to Education and Society to more accurately reflect the scope of the program of study.

These changes clarify the purpose of the minor and enable the department to expand its minor offerings to attract more undergraduate students to study the field of Education.
