

The Program on the Environment (PoE) is creating a new course titled "ENVIR 280: Natural History: Knowing Our Non-human Neighbors" focused on an introduction to the fundamental skills about the observation and representation of nature – an introduction to the field of natural history. Our intent is to have this course serve as an option for one of the two, required courses for the 'Biology' requirement of the Environmental Studies major. With this revision to the major requirements, students will have options to pair the BIOL 180: Introductory Biology course with one of three choices that do not require more than the one quarter of Chemistry required for the major: BIOL 250: Marine Biology, BIOL 118: Survey of Physiology (Human physiology), or ENVIR 280: Natural History.
