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EXPLANATION OF AND RATIONALE FOR PROPOSED CHANGE

For new program, please include any relevant supporting documentation such as student learning outcomes, projected enrollments, letters of support and departmental handouts. (Use additional pages if necessary).

This change amends the Slavic language minor requirements to allow two new Slavic linguistics courses (SLAV 110 and SLAV 210) to count as electives. We have also added Slovenian language (as SLVN 406) to the list of principal Eastern European languages that satisfy the foreign language proficiency requirement for the minor. We have removed SLVN 401, 402, & 404 from the list of electives so that students cannot substitute courses in a second Eastern European language for advanced classes in their principle language and/or Slavic linguistics courses. We have also updated the catalog language to reflect the fact that students are allowed to count up to 25 credits from their principal Eastern European language as electives in the minor after they complete the third quarter of the second year of that language (e.g. BCS 401-405 will count as electives after the student completes BCS 406). This makes the minor consistent with our Eastern European Language, Literature, & Culture major in this regard.




