The faculty of the University of Washington Tacoma recently voted to align themselves with University of Washington Seattle policy and no longer require English composition as a requirement for general University admission. This policy will be effective for autumn quarter 2012 admission.				
The faculty of the Social Work Program would like to ensure that students in the social welfare major are adequately prepared for the reading, writing and comprehension required in major coursework. Therefore, the social welfare major would like to add English composition with a 2.0 minimum grade as a prerequisite for admission to the major.

Hi Diane,
Thanks for following up on those things. I had Mary Lou Balassone and Lin
Murdock weigh in on the cross-listing question and about adding English
composition. UW Seattle approves this request. If you need any additional letter
of support, let me know. Lin did give some feedback, which I've pasted below, in
case you find it helpful. It does not change our approval of the request.
 "When they ask for Course title in the first section, they actually want the
department to write the existing or new course title, not write "existing".
Secondly, I don't have concerns, per say, but they really don't need to
establish the co-listing to accomplish what they want to do - they only have to
check the "Add course to the following approved major/minor elective list - add
to the T SOC WF major" and that would do it. I try to avoid co-listings as much
as possible because they confuse students, can mess up things like room
reservations, and overall make things difficult. There's nothing that
precludes them from putting a T CRIM class (or 3) on the T SOC W allowed
elective list.
  Now, there's nothing really wrong with what they are doing - it's just making
it more complicated.
  So, they can be turned in this way, but they may get bounced back to
Tacoma...

> I hope you are well and that you got at least a tiny bit of a break.
> I have a few things to mention to you:
> 1) I believe I emailed you some weeks ago about our adding English composition
> as an admissions requirement (BASW) and about our desire to cross-list 3 of
> our criminal justice courses with BASW course numbers. These three courses
> are: T CRIM 430 Children of Incarcerated Parents, T CRIM 361 Addictions and
> Mental Illness in Criminal Justice, and T CRIM 433 Crisis and Trauma
> Interventions with Crime Victims. All three courses are taught in our
> criminal justice major by social workers. We believe they are very relevant
> for social work students. All three would be considered electives. Would you
> email your approval of these (English Comp and cross-listing the 3 courses) so
 that we could have the approval available for the campus and university
 curriculum committees? This will probably save us time and paperwork in the
