Memo regarding Changing Undergraduate Academic Programs request to the Education, Learning, & Society Minor submitted by Claire Fraczek for Spring 2013:

To clarify text

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On page 1 of the attached document:

Explanation of and rationale for proposed change:

Line 2, ".....sequential service learning...." is clarified by Claire Fraczek per email exchange with Mary Clevenger-Bright, COE Curriculum Committee Member for Undergraduate Programs:

"....Dream Project (DP) courses are structured so that students begin in a linked 260/369 combo, and then if they want to continue with DP they can take 360/369, AND/OR 361/369. The 369 course will always show up because this is the field placement work that is attached to any course a DP student takes. For the ELS minor, it doesn't matter which of these combinations a student uses, although it will be most common to see 260/369. While the courses are sequential on the DP side, the sequencing does not determine whether or not the courses may be applied to the ELS field experience area (all will count).

On page 3 of the attached document:

Proposed Catalog Copy:

"Field Experience:[language should read per above clarification] any combination of 260/369, 360/369, AND/OR 361/369 in addition to the list of EDUC 401, GEN ST 346, and/or GEN ST 470......"

On page 3 of the attached document:

"Field Experience:[language should read per above clarification]....student may substitute one of the following:

if they are in the ECFS Major: current language is accurate. If they are in the ELS Minor: eliminate ECFS 303, 304, 305, 454, 455, 456 from this substitution list as students must be in the ECFS Major to enroll in these required ECFS courses.
