The criminal justice faculty believe that all criminal justice majors should have a required criminological theory class. As such T CRIM 362 Criminological Theory (5cr) was developed and approved. All faculty of the Social Work program unanimously voted to require T CRIM 362 instead of requiring T CRIM 271 Introduction to the Sociology of Deviance and Social Control (5cr). T CRIM 271 will remain an approved elective for criminal justice majors.

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



