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EXPLANATION OF AND RATIONALE FOR PROPOSED CHANGE

The Global Honors Program, instituted in Fall 2005 through a grant from the UW Provost's Fund for Innovation and Redesign, currently operates like a Minor, with at least 24 credits of required core classes. The planned expansion of the Program from upper division to four-years starting in Spring 2014, has necessitated the re-inclusion of such courses as TGH 203: Themes in Global Honors and TGH 491: Research Methods Seminar, making it possible for students to obtain a Minor in the Program with 25 credits and above. The proposed **Minor in Global Engagement** will allow Global Honors to better deliver on its campus-serving mission by increasing accessibility to its rigorous global curriculum, scholarships, study abroad and experiential learning opportunities, community engagement, and leadership support. It is proposed not just as a next step in the long-term development of the Program, but also as a direct response to student need, particularly those in such majors as Business and Computer Science. Currently students in these majors (as also those in several of the IAS majors) can take Global Honors courses only as electives. Availability of a Minor in Global Engagement will help students accomplish multiple academic goals efficiently. Students graduating from the Program with 24 credits or more will receive the Global Honors distinction on their transcripts, as is the case currently. Those completing 25 credits and above, will also receive a Minor in Global Engagement transcription.
