In the 20+ years that the Foster School's Buerk Center for Entrepreneurship has been offering a curriculum in entrepreneurship, we've seen increasingly strong demand from students in other disciplines for entry into the classes. In the 15+ years that we have organized the UW Business Plan Competition, we've seen that the majority of the 100 or more teams that apply to participate in the event are cross-disciplinary.						
The demand for entrepreneurship courses is strong, and we know from experience that the courses that have both business and nonbusiness students in them are more diverse, more productive, and more thoughtful. We now want to create a minor in entrepreneurship for nonbusiness undergraduates to expand the reach of entrepreneurship across the University of Washington. We've been sought out by deans and department chairs in engineering, the sciences, the iSchool, drama, etc., who are telling us that their students are asking about entrepreneurship courses. This proposed minor is the result of a year-long exploration of the needs of nonbusiness students and discussion with engineering and science faculty about how a minor would fit with their curricular requirements.						
According to the Kauffman Foundation, the average age of a first-time entrepreneur in the United States is 39. But college-aged entrepreneurs are a completely different group. Those students who are very interested in entrepreneurship start their first companies while in college or within 5 years of graduation. They become the serial entrepreneurs—the repeat performers. We want more of them coming out of the University of Washington.


Continuation Policy, ENTRE Minor

Jennifer - OK, by end of my day, not by end of yours. Hope I got it I under the wire.

The Undergraduate Programs Office (UPO) monitors the academic performance of students in the entrepreneurship minor. Students must maintain a 2.0 cumulative GPA in courses required for the minor. If a course is repeated, both grades are counted in the GPA (while credit is only assigned once). At the end of every quarter, the UPO reviews the performance of all students in the minor. A student will be placed on academic probation at the end of any quarter in which the cumulative GPA in minor coursework falls below 2.0. After one quarter on probation, if the student does not raise the cumulative GPA of the minor coursework to a 2.0, the student will be dropped from the entrepreneurship minor and would have to apply for admission to the minor.
