

In the past we have found that a senior thesis is too difficult for students to complete within 5 credits (in a single quarter), resulting in a noticeably less rigorous final project. Essentially, students do not have enough time to research a topic, define their area of focus, and produce a unique scholarly project.					
To resolve this issue, we propose eliminating the 5-credit thesis and making a 10-credit senior thesis the minimum requirement, while retaining the 15-credit thesis option. With this curricular change, we will provide students with additional time and support for guided research.					
Because we are adding an additional 5 credits to the thesis requirement, we also propose increasing the number of required credits for the major from 55 to 60.
