Guidelines for Admission Requirements to Majors

- 1. Admission course prerequisites should be generally available to freshman or sophomores, and should apply to general education requirements if the student is not subsequently admitted.
- 2. Admission course prerequisites should generally be available at community colleges.
- 3. Prerequisite courses for admission to the major should be at the 100 or 200 level.
- 4.—No more than 20 specifically required credits should be required as admission to majors in the College of Arts and Sciences.

Guidelines for Admission Requirements to <u>Undergraduate</u> <u>Programs</u>

<u>Submission of UW Form 1503 is required to create or change admission requirements for an</u> <u>undergraduate program. Suspending admission to an undergraduate program is considered a</u> <u>change in admission requirements. Before implementation, a temporary suspension of</u> <u>admissions, not to exceed one academic year, must be approved by FCAS (via form 1503) at least</u> <u>one quarter prior the suspension and may require a RECP.</u>
