## Proposed Catalog Copy: Minor in History of War and Society

History of War and Society: 30 credits from approved course list, of which 20 credits must be upper-division, with a minimum 2.00 cumulative GPA in courses applied towards the minor. A minimum of 15 of the 20 credits must be completed in residence at UW Seattle campus. Up to 5 credits may overlap with other minors.

#### Minor in History of War and Society

This minor explores experiences of civil and international wars as a means to question how violence, conflict, and other traumatic acts have shaped political, social, and cultural formations in the past and present. In addition to military history, courses in this minor examine the following aspects of war's linkage to society: how the experiences and exigencies of war create conditions for broader changes, including changes in notions of territorial integrity, sovereignty, national belonging, citizenship, gender, and race, as people are called to serve in battle zones and on the home front; how war fractures social and national cohesion; how the techniques and technologies of war propel new developments in national and regional security arrangements and transform economic, military, and political institutions; how major wars affect geopolitics and ideological conflicts; how wars and war experiences are represented in historical narratives and commemorated and remembered at the national, local, and individual levels; how questions of violence, trauma, reconciliation, and peace are dealt with in different societies.
