

## Proposed Catalog Copy: Minor in History of Religion and Society

History of Religion and Society: 30 credits from approved course list, of which 20 credits must be upper-division, with a minimum 2.00 cumulative GPA in courses applied towards the minor. A minimum of 15 of the 20 credits must be completed in residence at UW Seattle campus. Up to 5 credits may overlap with other minors.

### Minor in History of Religion and Society

This minor explores the development of religious traditions worldwide, asking how religious beliefs, practices, and institutions have helped shape culture, politics, and ideology from pre-modern times to the present. Courses in the minor push students to consider the multifarious ways in which religion structures society and is structured by it. Themes that students will engage in this minor include: how individuals negotiate faith; how religion informs ethical systems; the development of theology; the processes by which orthodoxy is defined; the conception of heresy and the persecution of unorthodox groups; how religions encounter and interact with one another; the economic and social aspects of religion; how religion influences conceptions of gender, family organization, and expressions of sexuality; religion as an impetus for expansion and exploration, and as a rationale for conquest and colonization; the use of religion as a political tool; religion as a force for social reproduction that helps to maintain existing social practices and structure; religion and secularization; religion as a vehicle for social change.
