- 3. At least 30 upper-division credits completed in residence at the UW
- 4. 5 credits of HIST 388, to be completed no later than within two quarters of declaring the major
- 5. 5 credits of undergraduate senior seminar (as designated by the department)
- 6. Beyond the required subjects, the student may or may not specialize, depending upon personal interests and career plans.
- 7. A minimum GPA of 2.25 for all history courses and minimum grade of 2.0 in all history courses taken to fulfill requirements for the major.

60 credits, to include:

- 3. At least 30 upper-division **History** credits completed in residence at the UW
- 4. 5 credits of HIST 388, to be completed no later than within two quarters of declaring the major
- 5. 5 credits of undergraduate senior seminar (as designated by the department)
- 6. Approved electives to reach 60 credits.
- 7. Beyond the required subjects, the student may or may not specialize, depending upon personal interests and career plans.
- 8. A minimum GPA of 2.25 for all history courses and minimum grade of 2.0 in all history courses taken to fulfill requirements for the major.
