Updates to General Catalog: JSIS Curriculum Changes

In a memorandum dated March 22, 2013, International Studies applied for consolidation of its courses in comparative religion and Jewish studies under a single curriculum prefix, JSIS C (see attachment I). This action was approved by the UW Curriculum Review Committee on April 16, 2013, and put into practice in the Time Schedule, the Degree Audit system, and JSIS Web pages and documents during spring quarter 2013.

This memorandum provides a summary of the changes that should be made in the General Catalog as a result of new designations for the comparative religion and Jewish studies courses (attachment II). It covers all *JSIS* catalog references to former JSIS B courses, with one exception: the text for the minor in International Studies. In that program the shift of courses from JSIS B to JSIS C necessitated a change in the wording of one of the program requirements. A formal Form 1503 is therefore being submitted to modify the International Studies minor.

SUBJECT:

JSIS Curriculum Reform

In Autumn Quarter 2012 the Jackson School launched a new course numbering system organized around five new curriculum prefixes:

Core courses
Area studies courses
Global and topical courses
Courses related to languages and special programs
Infrequently taught courses

A year's experience with the new course numbering system has shown that we need to improve the visibility of courses associated with our Comparative Religion and Jewish Studies programs by bringing them together in a single curricular prefix. (Currently these courses are intermixed with globally-focused courses under JSIS B, and also appear under the JSIS and JSIS D prefixes in certain instances.)

To better organize our thematically-focused courses and assist students in locating them in the Time Schedule, the JSIS faculty proposes the following changes:

- 1. Curriculum prefix JSIS C, now reserved for language study and special programs, will be dedicated to courses in Comparative Religion and Jewish Studies.
- 2. Courses currently in JSIS C will be moved to the now-unpopulated JSIS E prefix.
- 3. JSIS's Time Schedule headings will be revised as follows:

JSIS	Core and Gateway
JSIS A	Area Studies
JSIS B	Global and Thematic
JSIS C	Comparative Religion and Jewish Studies
JSIS D	Distance Learning and Professional
JSIS E	Language

4. Course prefixes and numbers will be revised according to the attached chart.
