The proposed changes to admission requirements are designed to work with recent changes in our advising staffing structure and to create a more predictable cycle of admission to the major. Our Advising office now employs three full-time professional advisers; previously it had two professional advisers and two half-time graduate students. Time that had been spent training and managing new graduate students each year can now be devoted to group information sessions with our students. With specific admission deadlines, the advisers will be able to create group advising sessions for all of the newly admitted students to cover the important but prosaic information about: departmental resources, major requirements, university requirements, deadlines, internships and other departmental opportunities. Advisers will still be meeting with students individually at the point of admission to the major, but they will be able to focus on specific student issues and individual learning goals. This is a direct response to information gathered from our departmental exit survey of graduating majors. Having specific due dates for adding the major will also give us more accurate information about the number of students in the major, allowing for better planning for upcoming quarters. Removing the requirement for sophomore standing (completion of at least 45 credits) to declare the major. Some students are ready to declare the major as freshmen, usually because of Running Start or AP credit. With this change students may now declare the major upon completing the introductory requirements regardless of class level.
