**EXPLANATION OF AND RATIONALE FOR PROPOSED CHANGE**

This change amends the EELLC major requirements to allow an additional 15 (instead of 25) credits from the "principal Eastern European language" course to also count as electives in the major. This makes the EELLC major more equivalent to our major in Russian (for which we allow up to 15 credits from RUSS 303, 401, and 402 to count as electives in the major). The faculty agreed that students completing the EELLC major must take 10 additional credits in literature and culture courses to demonstrate a command of more than just the principal language itself. To clarify, 5 credits of BCS/BULGR/CZECH/POLSH/ROMN/SLVN/UKR 406 will count towards the minimum 50 credits required for the major, and up to an additional 15 credits from the same principal language will also count as electives toward the major (20 total). Prior to this change, 30 total credits could come from the principal language.




