Rationale for the Minor in Gender Studies:			.1

Drawing from a number of programs, the Minor in Gender Studies brings together courses from across the university and encourages students to think critically about the significance of gender in art, in history, in society and in our daily lives.

Students are increasingly seeking classes that use gender as an interdisciplinary lens. Growing interest in courses that incorporate gender into the curriculum speaks to this demand. Advisors continue to articulate student interest in a Minor in Gender Studies, and have recommended that faculty pursue this minor to better satisfy student demand. Currently, there is a Gender Studies Track in the Ethnic, Gender, and Labor Studies (EGLS) major within IAS. While it does provide a framework of courses within the EGLS major that interested students can follow, this track does not appear on transcripts and is not tracked in DARS. Students in EGLS will be able to take this minor (providing that only 10 credits of courses are counted towards both) and have this specialty recorded on their transcripts. The minor will also be attractive to students from other majors in IAS (such as History, Psychology, and Politics, Philosophy, and Economics) and across campus (such as Criminal Justice and Urban Studies) who are interested in adding some focused coursework on gender issues to their main area of expertise.

This minor codifies the diverse set of gender themed courses that already exist at UWT and offers students the opportunity to document their mastery of Gender Studies. Doing so will encourage students both to think carefully and critically about how masculinity and femininity shape our modern world as well as to develop gender literacy as a central component of civic engagement. Students graduating with a Minor in Gender Studies will be well positioned as critical thinkers and engaged citizens. Their training will showcase skills ranging from fluency in various styles of communication and presentation to creative problem solving, and will enable them to speak confidently across a range of contemporary social issues.

Students who obtain a Minor in Gender Studies are expected to be able to:

- Articulate how intersections of race, class, nation, sexuality and other categories of difference shape understanding of gender, both in the U.S. and globally.
- Identify and analyze contemporary social questions using diverse social theories including queer and feminist theories.
- Situate gender in broader histo-cultural and geo-political contexts.
- Demonstrate critical awareness of social justice and collective activism as it pertains to women, gender and sexuality.
