

The sustainability minor gives students grounding in sustainability practice and theory, and creates a foundational understanding of local and global problems from a social, economic and environmental perspective. Solutions for many of the complex, large scale sustainability issues, such as social injustice, economic inequity, environmental destruction and climate change, require an understanding of these issues from multiple perspectives. The minor in sustainability would be valuable for students from any major, as it provides an overlap of the multiple perspectives where sustainability solutions exist while enhancing student's sustainability literacy.

UWT Minor in Sustainability – (32-35 credits) At least 10 credits are required to be upper division, at least 60% of credits taken must not overlap with major requirements.
