While our current gateway courses, Dance 250 and Dance 251, will still be required for the major, it will no longer be a requirement to take one of them before the student can declare the major. As a small department, these excellent courses are highly valued, but only offered once each year. Using them as a gateway to the major often forced students to delay declaring the major. The new plan allows a student to declare the major once they have taken any combination of six credits from the required core courses required for the major.

Our revision seeks to do the following:

- Offer more flexibility along with breadth and depth in schedule and course options.
- Reduces the number of credits required for the major to a more manageable and realistic number (in

alignment with other BA programs around the country). Retain some technical proficiency requirement but think more broadly about what "technique" means in dance by allowing our many cultural dance forms to count toward "technique requirement." (Salsa, Swing, Tango, African, Improvisation, etc.) Use a broader approach to electives in order to work with students to support particular interests and career goals. For ex: a person who is double majoring in biology and dance may be able to take courses to help them prepare, ultimately for a career in physical therapy. #### **Current DANCE MAJOR:**

#### **Bachelor of Arts**

#### Program Admission Requirements

Applicants who meet the following requirements are accepted during autumn, winter, and spring quarters on a rolling basis.

- 1. Minimum 2.00 cumulative GPA.
- Interview with Dance Program adviser to assess applicant's dance background, goals and interests, time to degree, and preparation for the major to ensure proper placement in dance coursework.
- 3. Dance Studies Option: Admission is competitive and is based on the applicant's capacity to engage in rigorous and independent research and writing with faculty supervision. Applicants complete DANCE 250, submit a Dance Studies application, and submit a writing portfolio of DANCE 250 course assignments.
- 4. Creative Studies Option: Either DANCE 250 or DANCE 251. Applicants must also be currently enrolled in a UW dance technique course (ballet or modern) so faculty can determine demonstration of minimum level of dance skill required to ensure the timely completion of requirements, and to evaluate appropriate level for further dance study.

# Major Requirements

Minimum 57-67 credits in dance as follows:

- 1. Core Curriculum (<del>20-25</del> credits)
  - a: Gateway Course (5 credits): DANCE 250 or DANCE 251. (Students enrolled in the dance studies option must take DANCE 250 as their gateway course.)
  - b. Dance History (5 credits): DANCE 344 or DANCE 345.
  - e. Cross Cultural Studies (0-5 credits): One of DANCE 234, DANCE 250, DANCE 336, DANCE 350, or DANCE 420. (If DANCE 250 is taken as the gateway course, the cross-cultural requirement is satisfied and no other course from the cross-cultural list is required, except for students enrolled in the Dance Studies option, who take DANCE 350 or DANCE 420 in addition to DANCE 250).
  - d. Technique (10 credits): From approved dance technique courses. See adviser for list of approved technique courses for each option. This requirement may be waived for students pursuing the dance studies option who have professional dance experience or those with a focus on dance form(s) not offered in the dance program curriculum. If the requirement is

waived, students need to complete an additional 10 credits of approved electives.

- 2. Creative Studies Option (47 credits)
  - a. Required Courses (minimum 26-credits): DANCE 166, DANCE 242, DANCE 266, DANCE 270 (at least 1 credit), DANCE 271 (at least 1 credit), DANCE 480, DANCE 493, DANCE 494.
  - b. Dance Electives: At least 3 credits from DANCE 234, DANCE 235, DANCE 251, DANCE 290, DANCE 336, DANCE 350, DANCE 366, DANCE 371, DANCE 420, DANCE 450, DANCE 490, DANCE 499.
  - c. Technique: 18 credits from the following (12 credits minimum at the 300 level or above; 6 credits minimum in both ballet and modern dance; a maximum of 6 credits in the alternative movement studies series can be counted toward major technique requirements): DANCE 104, DANCE 105, DANCE 106, DANCE 107, DANCE 108, DANCE 109, DANCE 110, DANCE 111, DANCE 112, DANCE 201, DANCE 202, DANCE 203, DANCE 204, DANCE 205, DANCE 206, DANCE 210, DANCE 203, DANCE 212, DANCE 230, DANCE 231, DANCE 232, DANCE 233, DANCE 236, DANCE 237, DANCE 238, DANCE 239, DANCE 241, DANCE 301, DANCE 302, DANCE 303, DANCE 304, DANCE 305, DANCE 306, DANCE 310, DANCE 311, DANCE 312, DANCE 401, DANCE 402, DANCE 403, DANCE 404, DANCE 405, DANCE 406.
- 3. Dance Studies Option (37-credits)
  - a. Required Courses (9 credits): DANCE 350 or DANCE 420, DANCE 415 and DANCE 416.
  - b. Dance Electives (minimum 17 credits): At least 17 credits from the following: DANCE 166, DANCE 234, DANCE 235, DANCE 242, DANCE 251, DANCE 266, DANCE 270, DANCE 271, DANCE 290, DANCE 336, DANCE 344 (if not taken as part of core curriculum), DANCE 345 (if not taken as part of core curriculum), DANCE 366, DANCE 414, DANCE 420, DANCE 450, DANCE 480, DANCE 490, DANCE 493, DANCE 494, and DANCE 499.
  - e. Approved Electives (minimum 11 credits): Approved elective courses based on individual interests and decided in conjunction with Dance Program adviser and faculty.

# **Program Admission Requirements**

Applicants who meet the following requirements are accepted during autumn, winter, spring and summer quarters on a rolling basis.

- 1. Minimum 2.00 cumulative GPA
- 2. Successful completion of six credits in any of the required core courses for the major.
- 3. Be registered in or have successfully completed at least one technique course.

#### **Major Requirements**

Minimum 54-66 credits in dance as follows:

- 1. Core Courses (27-29 credits): DANCE 166; DANCE 242; DANCE 250; DANCE 251; DANCE 271; and DANCE 493; one of DANCE 101, DANCE 290, DANCE 344, or DANCE 345.
- 2. <u>Technique Courses: Minimum 15 credits selected from approved 200-level or higher dance technique courses. See adviser for approved list.</u>
- 3. One of the following:
  - a. <u>Electives (min. 12 credits)</u>: 12 credits of approved electives. See adviser for approved list. A core course or technique course on the electives list may not be used for both an elective and technique/core requirement.
  - b. Dance Studies option (18 credits):
    - i. either DANCE 350 or DANCE 420; DANCE 415; DANCE 416
    - ii. <u>Minimum 9 credits additional approved electives based on individual interests and</u> agreed to in conjunction with Dance Program Adviser or faculty member.
  - c. Creative Studies Option (22 credits):
    - i. DANCE 266; DANCE 270; DANCE 480; DANCE 493; DANCE 494;
    - ii. Minimum 10 additional credits selected from approved advanced 300-level or higher dance technique courses. See adviser for approved list.
- 4. Minimum 2.00 cumulative GPA for courses applied to the major.
