To Whom It May Concern:

Thank you for your feedback on the proposed Gender Studies Minor. We agree to add a requirement of a certain number of upper division courses, but would like to require students take 10 upper division credits rather than the usual 15. This is due to the way this minor fits into the broader curriculum in IAS.

The Gender Studies minor includes two foundational courses, TWOMN 100 and TWOMN 205, which serve a very important purpose across the curriculum. These two popular courses are taken by a range of majors across campus, and serve as a broad introduction to the topics of Women's Studies and Masculinities. They belong in the lower division. However, they are also appropriate choices to serve as the required courses for this minor, since they lay a solid introductory foundation for the rest of the curriculum. With these 10 credits in required lower division courses, the remaining 15 elective credits would be constrained to the upper division. Of the 39 electives, only five are lower division. If we required 15 credits to be upper division, that would limit student access to these five courses, which include some very appropriate and interdisciplinary choices, such as Women in Science, a psychology course on human sexuality, and a seminar in service learning.
