Explanation and Rationale for Name Change from Bachelor of Science in Information Technology and Systems to Bachelor of Science in Information Technology.							
When the Information Technology and Systems (ITS) program was created in 2009, it was modeled after the existing Computer Science and Systems (CSS) and Computer Engineering and Systems (CES) programs already being taught at the Institute of Technology. All three programs have a systems science component in their program that studies the nature of complex systems. The ITS program as well as the other programs are gearing up for ABET accreditation in 2016. ABET headquarters has informed the program that in order for the ITS program to undergo the accreditation process, it must do so under the Information Technology and Information Systems criteria due to the current name of Information Technology and Systems. The Information Systems criteria requires additional courses and faculty with Information Systems terminal degrees, neither of which the ITS faculty wishes to pursue.

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The change in name seems reasonable since there is no interest in adding courses or including faculty that would allow for Information Systems terminal degrees. The change would facilitate ABET accreditation process expected to occur in 2016.

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I'm ourious why the degree as originally approved (and currently delivered) did not include more Info Systems coursework? Were accreditation requirements for such a degree different at the time? If not, then why weren't hiring/staffing strategies pursued in the past that would have supported building out the curriculum appropriately?

If the accreditation requirements for such a degree programs are in the process of becoming more stringent, then how and why does the degree as currently delivered fit better with the overall programming of the institute and needs of the institute's current (and forecasted) student populations?

The IT program has not been previous accredited. When the Information Technology and Systems program was created 4 years it centered itself on the 5 pillars of IT: Programming, Networking, Database, Human Computer Interaction, and Web. The overall umbrella is security. We do not have a large information systems component, we have some parts in our database courses, it is a pillar but not the central theme. The accreditation requirements have not become more stringent, the problem is having "Information" and "Systems" together in the same title. We are not an information systems program, we never intended to be, and it is not what our students need.
