
Dear Bob:

Based upon the recommendation of its Subcommittee on Admissions and Programs, the Faculty Council on Academic Standards has recommended approval of the change in degree requirements for the Bachelor of Business Administration. A copy of the change is attached.

Transfer students entering the University through Autumn Quarter 1991 must be exempted from changes in the requirements according to the Higher Education Coordinating Board's "Policy on Inter-college Transfer and Articulation Among Washington Public Colleges and Universities."

Explanation of proposed changes (or new program) and desired implementation date:

Currently pre-business students must present 30 hours of social science courses for admission, in addition to satisfying other general education, proficiency, and pre-business core requirements. These 30 hours of social sciences comprise 10 hours of economics, 10 hours of behavioral social sciences, and 10 additional hours chosen from "Group II-Social Sciences" on the Distribution List. A recent review of the School of Business undergraduate program concluded that the business curriculum places a strong emphasis on the social sciences but too little emphasis on the humanities. Our proposal maintains the requirement of 20 hours from economics and behavioral social sciences; the 10 additional hours would be chosen from "Group I-Humanities" (Parts A or B), or "Group II-Social Sciences," Part B only. The Business faculty view courses on Part B of the social science list as similar in content and approach to humanities courses in general. Effective by Winter 1991 Business School admission for UW natives; Winter 1992 for transfers. (A grace period of one year will be allowed for students who have relied upon earlier printed information and advising.)
